

Where are we located?

From I-25 N: Take exit 299. At the stop sign, take a left. You will cross over the interstate on a bridge and come to a T-intersection. Turn left; you will come to a gate house and arrive!

From I-25 S: Take exit 299. Turn right. You will come to a T-intersection. Turn left; you will come to a gate house and arrive!

What is the weather like?

Glorieta is located in a high mountain desert around 7,500 ft. The weather tends to be very dry with low humidity. The altitude and dry air can cause altitude sickness and dehydration. For this reason, encourage your camper to bring a water bottle and drink plenty of water while they are here.

During the summer, highs will reach the 80's or low 90's and days are normally sunny and can be cooler at night.

During the winter, highs can be in the 30's or 40's during the day and drop to lower 20's or teens at night. We also get snow and there can be ice as well.

Where will your child be staying?

At Glorieta Camps, we offer hotel-style rooms, dorm-style rooms and lodges. The lodging type for each group is determined by the group leader and assigned according to availability.

If the group is staying in **hotel-style rooms**, those rooms are furnished with queen or king size beds and there is a bathroom in the room. TV's are not offered in these rooms and Wifi is not offered unless deemed necessary by the group leader.

Dorm style rooms are in various buildings around camp and depending on which one is reserved will determine if there are 4 or 6 people per room. Each room is furnished with twin size bunk beds, there is a bathroom and sink in each room. Linens are not provided and bedding and bathrooms linens will need to be sent with your child.

Lodges are similar to dorm style rooms and are furnished with twin size bunk beds, and there are varying number of beds per room depending on which lodge the group has reserved. Bedding and bath linens will need to be brought by your child if they are staying in a lodge.

What is the terrain like?

Because we are in the high desert there are places with rocks and dirt paths. Most of the areas in the main part of camp have a few gentle slopes and paved walkways. When going to an activity or on a hike, there are dirt pathways that can be rugged or steep.

What cell phone providers work at Glorieta?

Verizon service works the best at camp, other services such as AT&T, Sprint, and T-Mobile also work the coverage is just spotty and may only work in certain areas of camp.

What will your child be doing during activity time?

Some group leaders choose to sign their group up for a Glorieta run activity. Some of the activities that the leader can choose from include things like rock climbing, group development, mountain scooters, guided hikes, or blacklight dodgeball. Our activities are **challenge by choice** and our staff will encourage your child to participate in all of the activities that are offered, however, we want your child to make the choice to participate in activities that may push them out of their comfort level and will not make them participate if they are not comfortable. Encourage your child to try new things but let them know it is their own choice. Tennis Shoes are encouraged for most activities and it is likely they will be walking quite a bit.

What medical services are provided?

Glorieta Camps does not provide first aid for Rental Groups. The organization bringing the group is responsible for providing first aid and all necessary supplies to participants of the event. The organization should have one person appointed as "First Aid Officer" to serve the group. In the event of a medical emergency or major accident, Glorieta Camps staff will participate in emergency response by contacting the local Emergency Medical Services and assisting with patient care until EMS arrives, as is consistent with the training of staff available at the time. In general, EMS response time averages under 15 minutes.

What if your child has food allergies?

Glorieta is a nut-free kitchen, we are also able to accommodate gluten-free and vegan diets. If your child needs special meals while they are here, you should have completed that information as a part of the registration process. If there are even more allergies that need to be accommodated for, you are welcome to send food with your child. There is a fridge and microwave in the dining hall that is for those that choose to bring their own meals. Please label the food with your child's name, the dates they will be on site and the name of the organization they are coming with.

What if you need to contact your child?

While your child is here, you are welcome to contact the group leader that is sponsoring the trip, if you are still unable to reach them, you are welcome to call **505.699.5031** and you will reach the Retreat Host who can try to contact the group leader. Please be prepared to give the organization that your child came with and/or the group leaders name.

How do we ensure your child's safety?

Our staff members go through extensive training on each and every one of our offered activities. Each of our activities are inspected daily by specially qualified staff.
