PHILOSOPHY OF MINISTRY AND MISSION STATEMENT

Our Mission Statement at Glorieta Camps is to inspire Christ-like change through outdoor adventure, authentic relationships, and Biblical truth. At Glorieta Camps, we desire to set ourselves apart from other camps. We want to give campers the opportunity to participate in activities that they are unable to encounter on a daily basis. We want to use those activities, such as rock climbing, mountain biking, drift trikes, and archery tag, as a tool to produce real, authentic relationships. These types of relationships allow for our adventurous activities to have an impact lasting beyond the memory of simply having fun. The vulnerability caused by participating in an activity outside of a camper's comfort zone can make way for an encouraging, powerful, and authentic relationship to be built. By building these authentic relationships throughout a camp experience, we are then able to present The Word of God in a way that is more meaningful and effective for our campers. Our hope is that the relationships built at camp will go beyond the week a camper will have at camp. By keeping in contact with parents and campers, we know a relationship that started at camp can carry impact into regular, everyday life.

WHAT TO EXPECT FROM US

Day Camp is a great opportunity for kids to get an introduction into camp. By allowing campers to participate in the activities and curriculum that make Glorieta Camps great while also giving them the opportunity to go home each day, campers are able to ease into the camp experience. As you send your kids to camp, we want to ease any and all concerns you may have. First off, know that the safety and protection of your campers is our priority. Each group of campers will have two highly trained and passionate counselors assigned to them. These staff members have gone through a rigorous hiring process, two weeks of extensive training, child protection plan procedures, and received both CPR and First Aid certifications. This training, combined with their heart for children's ministry and desire to share the love of Jesus, allow us to ensure that we have hired the best college students, from across the country, to be on our staff.

At camp, we do a lot of activity out in the sun and know how important it is for both our campers and staff to be nourished and reenergized with a healthy meal. Each day, we will provide your camper with lunch during our scheduled lunch hour. As lunch is included in your fees, please know that there will be no extra charge for this meal!

Here, at Glorieta Camps, we have a large range of activities. By offering activities such as rock climbing, arts and crafts, mini golf, and biking we hope that your child will be able to experience both old and new adventures.

Just as activities are a big part of the Glorieta Camp experience, curriculum shares a large part as well. Glorieta Camps is currently on a seven-year plan of walking through the Bible and this summer will be year seven. During year seven, we are focusing on Hebrews-Revelation for our lessons and Bible Studies.

WHAT WE EXPECT FROM YOU

As parents, you have the important job of preparing your child for camp. As your child will be away from you several hours each day and surrounded by new people, new activities, and a new environment, please take the time to talk to your child and get them ready for camp. An easy way to do this is by talking with them about the new activities such as rock climbing, drift trikes, archery tag, lake time, and friends they will make. By doing this, you will be able to help get your child's excitement flowing and build their anticipation. Rest is also an important way to prepare your camper for camp. As a week of camp will be full of non-stop fun, a good night of sleep will be essential in helping your camper enjoy their week of camp. Staying hydrated is another important element to a camper's enjoyment during the day. As we will be encouraging your child to be drinking water throughout the day, we ask that you start this process at home as well.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

ARRIVAL AND DEPARTURE

On Monday morning, the fun begins! Drop-off will take place between 8:00 AM and 8:30 AM at Glorieta Camps in our Prayer Garden. Signs, helping direct you to the right location, will be set up for both drop-off and pick-up times. As we are eager to get our day started directly at 8:30 AM, each day, we do ask that parents finish drop-off by this time. This will allow campers enough time to get into their cabin groups and transition to the first activity. At the end of each day of camp, pick-up will take place between 4:30 PM and 5:00 PM at Glorieta Camps in our Prayer Garden. If for any reason, a camper needs to be picked up early, parents must notify us as early as possible. It should be noted that no discount will be given if a camper comes for part of the week or has to leave early, at any point, during camp.

AUTHORIZED ADULTS

Authorized adults are the individuals allowed to pick-up your camper(s). These can be added during the registration process under the "Authorized Adults" section. To ensure safety, we will only allow people listed under 'Authorized Adults' to pick-up campers at the end of each day. A photo I.D. will also be required at pick-up, regardless of who is picking up the camper(s).

ACTIVITY UPGRADES

'Activity Upgrades' are a way for us to keep the overall cost of camp low while giving you the choice to send your camper on some extra adventure. This year we will be offering White Water Rafting during specific sessions. You will be able to add these upgrades to your week of camp during registration. Full details of these upgrades can be found on our website.

CAMP STORE AND CAMP CREDIT

At least once a week, usually on Friday, campers will have the opportunity to go to our Camp Store. Our store offers a variety of camp memorabilia including hats, shirts, sweatshirts, coffee mugs, whistles, frisbees, stickers, and hammocks. In addition to the store, we will also open up our Snack Shack which

will allow campers to purchase a variety of drinks, snacks and candy. A great way to eliminate lost money while at camp is through Camp Credit. Camp Credit can be bought through our online registration system and used at any of our camp stores throughout the summer. By purchasing Camp Credit you will also be able to see what your camper is spending their money on during each visit and how much they have left.

CLOSING CEREMONY

On Friday, between 4:00 and 4:30 PM, we will be opening up camp to parents! We want you to be a part of camp, just as much as your kids, because camp would be impossible without you! When you arrive on Friday, camp will not stop. By playing games, dancing to some crazy camp songs, and worshipping, we hope to give you a taste of what camp looks like each day! We will also be handing out Camper Awards to each camper. Our Camper Awards allow us to highlight some great qualities we saw in your campers, throughout the week.

In addition to Camper Awards, this year we will be awarding one male and one female camper the Luke 10:27 award. This award will go to two campers who modeled service and love to their peers and stood out for these actions.
